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## Catholicism in the continents

### Focus on Asia

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Italian Franciscan missionary, Giovanni da Montecorvino, who reached China in 1294, translated the New Testament into Uyghur. He died in 1328 in Beijing — the archbishop of Beijing who was apparently the only effective European bishop in medieval China. Even after his death, the Mission in China endured for the next 40 years.

However, various factors led to an ultimate shrinking of the church in China, but, six centuries later, Giovanni's translation of the Bible inspired another Franciscan, Gabriel Allegra, to go to China and complete the translation into Chinese in 1968.

Today, there are more Catholics in China than members of the Communist Party [about 100 million Catholics to 87.6 million party members] and some say that by 2030 there may be more Catholics in China than any other country in the world.

However, there remains many restrictions for the church, such as the requirement to register all church buildings with the government, and non-recognition of the Vatican's authority [the Chinese Communist Party oversees an official community, the Patriotic Association, believed to number about 12 million people, but there is a much larger underground church loyal to the Pope] with the main issue being who should have the final say in the appointment of bishops.

Pope Francis signaled his openness to dialogue with the Asian superpower while flying through Chinese airspace on 19 January on his way back to Rome from the Philippines, but Vatican-China relations remain difficult.

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## Our Pastors



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### Fr. William Bulloch



Fr. Bill's father was a Presbyterian who joined his mother as an Anglican the day their son was christened in Christ Church on 17 April 1912.

When his father died in 1912 when he was two, his mother and the four children moved from Gananoque to Toronto where he started learning to play the piano and became a chorister.

When Fr. Bill was 12, his mother remarried. Thus began Bill's turmoil of his teen years: an interruption of his education and his sour relationship with his step dad.

At age 19, when he could no longer tolerate his step-dad, he left home for Vancouver. His step dad died the next year. In B.C. he took on various odd jobs before he returned home to Toronto at age 21 where he met two Jesuits and after instructions from a Paulist, he became a Catholic on 1 June 1932.

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
