They know Jesus. His Love. His teachings. This is why our Sacred Heart choir is so much appreciated.

When Rafael Oei and his close-knit, parish-involved family came from Singapore in 2003, the parish was still observing the 20-year-old practice of the congregation being choristers with pianists, organists, guitarists and singers leading them. This was also to avoid complications of having one or more choirs in the parish. Today's choir evolved from singers who got together to enhance Easter and Christmas liturgies and, since 2008 -2009, the 10 a.m. Mass. From summer 2010, they started singing regularly for the 10 a.m. Mass. While the choir remains small, it does occasionally have up to 13 members, especially on feast days.

Their primary mission is to enhance the liturgy and to motivate and encourage the congregation to sing during church services. Rafael selects hymns based on the nature of the service, from suggestions from the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops' website, from the day's readings and from a prescribed list for Catholic Sunday Assembly [Years A, B and C] introduced by Monsignor Michael Lapierre in 2004.



Soon after coming to Sacred Heart, Rafael discovered that the congregation was not familiar with all the songs in blue *Glory and Praise* book and the green *Catholic Book of Worship III*. He slowly introduced other songs from both books that were never sung at Sacred Heart Church before to widen the repertoire from the list given by long-time Sacred Heart organist Bea Sheard. However, without copyright coverage he was limited in what he could print or select for congregation to sing.

Thus he came up with the idea of a Sacred Heart Hymn book to supplement the blue and the green hymnals. Fr. Alfred Alilio approved Rafael's enrollment in the church copyright program, and it took him about three months to select hymns from his years of playing for churches. He selected hymns that were a little more cheerful and upbeat, with some golden oldies in the mix. He

included some Christmas carols to dispense with the need for having loose sheets printed and distributed at Christmas Masses. The book, *From the Heart*, with 59 songs, besides the Mass parts, was introduced during Advent 2012. The parish printed 200 copies. The hymn book is a work in progress, and typos will be rectified in subsequent editions.

Rafael also oversees the audio system, piano and organ to ensure that they are in good working condition.

He welcomes anyone who would like to join the choir . . . to contribute and share their talents in singing or playing an instrument, all to enhance the liturgy. The choir practices at 9:30 a.m. before the 10 a.m. Mass, and for half an hour immediately after, at about 11 a.m. Contact Rafael at: rafoei@shaw.ca



Focus on Asia

On 27 July 1549, Saint Francis Xavier arrived in Japan along with Cosme de Torres, a Jesuit priest, and Fr. John Fernandes, but it was only on 15 August that they went ashore at Kagoshima, on the south western tip of Kyushu Island. They were welcomed by Shingon monks because Xavier used the word Dainichi for the Christian God, attempting to adapt the concept to local traditions. As Xavier learned more about the word's religious nuances, he changed to *Deusu* from the Latin and Portuguese *Deus*. The monks later realized that Xavier was preaching a rival religion and grew more aggressive towards his attempts at conversion.

In 1575, Pope Gregory XIII decided that Japan belonged to the Portuguese diocese of Macau. By 1579, at the height of missionary activity, there were about 130,000 converts, and in 1588, the diocese of Funai [Nagasaki] was founded.

By the end of the 16th century, the Japanese mission had become the largest overseas Christian community that was not under the rule of a European power. Nagasaki was called "the Rome of Japan" and most of its inhabitants were Christians.

The situation changed when Toyotomi Hideyoshi reunified Japan and he saw Christianity as a threat to national unity.

Fr. William Bulloch



Bill, soon after becoming a Catholic at age 22, drove to the Jesuit Novitiate in Guelph to make his first retreat. Then, since he had not yet graduated from high school, he enrolled for Grade 10 at Loyola High School in Montreal but had to take an extra year to graduate because he fell ill for two months in his final year.

In summer 1936, he took off from New York to Ireland, England and Scotland, returning in the fall to Canada where he was advised by a Jesuit to join the Discalced Carmelites in San Antonio, Texas.

However, after six months he decided that monastic life was not for him. He returned to Toronto where he entered St. Augustine's Seminary.

In 1941, Victoria's Bishop John Cody visited the seminary seeking applicants for the diocese and after meeting Bill, he was ordained to minor orders and thus became a member of the clergy of the Victoria Diocese. Three years later, he was ordained a priest by Toronto's Archbishop James McGuigan, who became a cardinal in 1946.
