

There's a familiar saying that goes, "God does not call the equipped; he equips the called."

God doesn't use you and send you because you're highly trained or full of self-confidence or because it's right down your alley in terms of the talents you possess. It's not because you're

rich in capability or rich in resources. He actually prefers to send the ones who have very little, the ones who are poor.

When we feel the Lord calling us to do something, the very first thing we should do is reflect on this week's Gospel and begin to see what possessions we need to *lose* before we head out with the Lord to participate in his will.

When we hear the word 'possessions', what always springs to mind? Most people think of all the material goods they own. Some of us own a lot and some of us not as much but all of us feel a pang when we think the Lord might like us to lose some of these possessions in order to be good disciples. The idea of simplifying our material goods becomes overwhelming and complex. Yes, it's true that sometimes our possessions own us and take up more of our focus than is healthy or necessary but the material goods we own are not the only possessions are the least of our problems. It's those other possessions we have that block us from opening up to God's love and his will for our lives.

Opinions: preferences and ideas that, when challenged, make us stubbornly and angrily dig in our heels and refuse to be moved.

Past wounds: the times when we want to hold on to our wounds and allow them to dictate to us what we will or won't do.


Control: to have everything go according to what makes us comfortable or how we've always done things, or perceive things should be done.

Ambitions: goals that start off pure but gradually begin to direct and run us until the goals become more important than the people involved in our lives.

Teachings we have received that somehow go twisted around to become rigid stances that keep us from the softness of acceptance, love, and compassion. Yes, we can be pretty possessive with our doctrines and our theologies.

No wonder Jesus sent out the disciples equipped with so little. He was freeing them to move. He was gifting them with the joy of being able to immediately respond to the leading of the Father. He was showing them the "Light Way". They had nothing to depend on except the Lord. Those disciples came back from that journey flying high; they couldn't believe all the wonderful things God did and how he allowed them the honour of participating in his power and grace. Freed from their possessions so they could dance with God. May we all be so blessed.

Our Lady of Mount Carmel 16 July 2024

Mt. Carmel was a sacred place dedicated to the Canaanite god Baal. In 1 Kings 18, Elijah declared a contest with 450 of his prophets to set a sacrifice on fire to determine which "god" was real, Baal or the God of Israel. The frenzy of the prophets of Baal was not successful. However, when Elijah prayed to the Lord, fire descended from heaven and lit the sacrifice (1 Kings 18:38-39). It was on Mt. Carmel, as well, that the prayer of Elijah secured the end of the drought

and famine that had befallen Israel.

"Carmel" is a Hebrew word for "garden of God", where we can walk with the Lord, as Adam and Eve did before they were banished (Gen. 3:8) Mount Carmel overlooks the Mediterranean, and the city and harbour of Haifa, Israel. It sits at the head of Valley of Jezreel, also known as the Valley of Megiddo. The Arabs know Carmel as the Mountain of Holy Elijah. In addition to 1 Kings 18, Carmel is mentioned over twenty times in Scripture, notably in Canticles 7:5.

In the 12th century, the Order of the Brothers of the Blessed Virgin of Mount Carmel was officially founded here. This order looks to the Old Testament prophets Elijah and Elisha as their spiritual fathers. Carmelites follow the Gospel and take on a deeply Marian character for an evangelical life, looking to the Blessed Mother as an ideal example of prayer, love, and contemplation.

It was in the 13th century on July 16, 1251, a time of persecution for the Carmelites, that the Blessed Virgin appeared to St. Simon Stock, a Prior of the Carmelites, and gave him the Brown Scapular. She said to him, "This is a privilege for you and the order: whoever dies wearing the Scapular will be saved. It is a sign of salvation, a sure safeguard in danger, a pledge of peace and of my special protection until the end of the ages."

The Scapular, or "Brown Scapular" from the colour of their habit, consists of two pieces of brown wool on a cord. The Scapular is a special garment of consecrated religious, known from the time of St. Benedict (6th century), and worn over their habit while working. From this practical purpose the Scapular came to be called "the yoke of Christ," a spiritual sign of devotion and piety. By putting on the garment, it attains its highest spiritual meaning as followers of Jesus are said to put on Christ Himself to remind us throughout the day of the need to persevere in Christ.

The Scapular should never be worn as a good luck charm, nor as an assurance of avoiding purgatory or hell whatever our behaviour. To do so would be superstitious and therefore in vain.

The last time Mary appeared at Fátima, she was dressed as Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Lúcia, one of the shepherd children, later said the Blessed Mother appeared this way because she "wants all to wear the Scapular. The reason for this is that the Scapular is our sign of consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary." Lúcia later became a Carmelite nun.

There have been many Carmelite saints, including Elizabeth of the Trinity, Teresa of the Andes, and Edith Stein, as well as Doctors of the Church, John of the Cross, Teresa of Avila, and St. Thérèse of Lisieux.

Our Lady of Mount Carmel is the patron saint of the Carmelite Order, for Chile, for Bolivia, for protection from danger, and for deliverance from Purgatory.


