
* 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time | 19 February 2023 *



I've said it before: God does not require anything of us that he does not practice himself.

In this Sunday's reading, the Antitheses continue with the familiar exhortations to give more than you are asked for, to turn the other cheek and to love your enemies. And Jesus and the Father do just that, always and everywhere. Try reading the beatitudes again, only this time read them as character descriptions of God. This is who he is and, when Jesus says, "Be perfect as the heavenly Father is perfect," he is simply saying, "Pull in your claws; stop being selfish and defensive. Be gentle. Stop following the letter of the law and start seeking out its true intent and its heart."

This isn't spiritual rocket science. Christ doesn't call us to flagellate ourselves or bring more hardship on ourselves than we already have. He knows life can be



pretty tough; he has been there. All he asks is that we don't lose sight of God's true heart, the heart that turns its cheek when it is ignored or castigated, the heart that wants to give rather than take, the heart that doesn't seek revenge, just restoration. He asks us to do the same because it's the only way we can survive as healthy families and communities (key word here is 'healthy'). The only way. The fact that the Church has survived through the ages is more down to God's merciful grace rather than human conviction of what it really means to follow Christ.

The first reading gives a clue to the true intent of the law as Jesus is interpreting it. God says to Moses, "You shall be holy for I, the Lord your God, am holy. You shall not hate in your heart any one of your kin; you shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge but you shall love your neighbor as yourself: I am the Lord."

Have we ever taken that as seriously as we need to?

FAST AND ABSTINENCE **DURING LENT**

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance in preparation for baptism and for the renewal of our baptismal vows at Easter.

Abstinence is to be observed from age 14 and older.

Fasting is to be observed from the age of 18, and who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday.

Days of Fast & Abstinence

Ash Wednesday, February 22, and Good Friday, April 7.

Fridays of Lent are compulsory days of abstinence when no meat is allowed during meals. In Canada, Catholics may substitute an act of charity in place of abstinence. However, it is strongly encouraged that some form of penitential discipline be undertaken.

On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Please Note: when health or ability to work are seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, consult the parish priest.




