

I confess, I was completely bereft of inspiration regarding this Gospel of Jesus calling the fishermen to leave their nets and follow him. They were called. Call is a word we use - I use - so frequently but what does it really mean for most of us? There are those we know who have definitely 'heard the call' but what do the vast majority of us really hear? What do we expect to hear? I was at Mass, praying in frustration for something pertinent to say about Jesus calling us, when a phrase dropped into my mind and heart and I felt peaceful release.

It was, "Human Whisperer."

We are all familiar with the term 'horse whisperer' but I had to research it to know what a horse whisperer actually does. A horse whisperer communicates with a horse through the horse's own body language and the most important part of that communication is building TRUST. A horse's primal instinct when it is fearful is flight but it will join with a different species when it feels protected there. The old school of thought was that a horse had to be broken and forcibly made to obey but a whisperer's high degree of understanding and patience alleviates the horse's fears and helps the horse back to a state of genuine relaxation. The horse then becomes tractable, part of the whisperer's 'tribe' and easy to lead.

Jesus is our whisperer. He was human so he knows of all our traumas and our instinct to take flight in the face of fear. His understanding and patience with us are immeasurable and it is not his intention to break us or forcibly make us obey, which is animal cruelty! His intention is to build trust with us then make us feel protected, secure and loved so we will willingly join his family...his species, or his tribe, the tribe of God, Spirit and Love.

So, if you haven't heard a loud call, listen for the Whisperer who calms you and brings you to a sense of safety and belonging.

I believe that's what the fishermen heard.

This Sunday, 21st January, the Church celebrates and honours the Word of God. This weekend is "devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the word of God" (Aperuit Illis, 3). We open our minds and hearts to welcome the Word as "a lamp for [our] feet, a light for [our] path" (cf. Ps. 118:105). God reveals Himself through His Word.

This year the theme is taken from the Gospel according to John: "Remain in my word" (Jn. 8:31). Sunday of the Word of God takes place when the Church celebrates dialogue between Jews and Catholics, and celebrates the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, giving it great ecumenical and communion significance. The Gospels this Sunday also relate to the beginning of the ministry and preaching of Jesus, the Word made flesh.

This weekend, the Book of the Gospels will join in the Entrance Procession and be placed at the centre of the Altar, giving prominence to the Word of God. Only the Eucharist and the Book of the Gospels enjoy the privilege of being placed on the Altar. This is why the Ambo, where the Word of God is proclaimed, and the Altar, where the Paschal Sacrifice is celebrated, are connected and given prominence. The connection of Christ as the Word becoming flesh, offered as the Paschal Sacrifice at the Altar: the fulfilment of the Covenant of God and the Law of Moses. The "two tables": that of the [Liturgy of the] Word and that of the [Liturgy of the] Eucharist, intertwined and celebrated during each Holy Mass. That is the beauty and treasure of the Catholic Church.

Memorial of St. Francis de Sales

Wed. 24 January

Born August 21, 1567, at the Château de Sales in the kingdom of Savoy near Geneva, Switzerland, into a noble family. By age 24, he obtained doctorates in canon and civil law, but chose religious life instead.

A leader of the Catholic Reformation, at a time when many were drawn to the new Protestant churches, Francis set out

to restore Catholicism in the region around Lake Geneva known as Chablais. Tirelessly and patiently preaching the ancient faith, he wrote leaflets clearly explaining the Catholic view, gradually re-establishing a strong Catholicism in that area. Thereafter, he was appointed Bishop of Geneva in 1602. He reorganized the diocese, reformed religious education, established a seminary, and founded schools. He died at Lyons on December 28, 1622 and was canonized in 1665.

He is the patron saint of writers and journalists, and of the deaf.


