A Weed

Last week I wrote about how all of us carry within us all the soil types mentioned by Jesus in the 'Sower and the Seed'. This week I want to focus on the first parable Jesus tells in the Gospel text about the enemy that sowed weeds among the wheat.

The householder instructs the servants not to pull up the weeds so as not to pull up the good plants with the weeds. In the end, both will be harvested and the weeds will be burned. A good apocalyptic parable, huh? In the end all the evil people will be dealt with harshly.

But wait a second. Are we assuming this is what will happen to other people, the people we think are nasty and irredeemable? That's a dangerous assumption because each one of us has beautiful wheat and each one of us has an abundance of weeds. That means that right now, God is allowing our weeds to flourish as well as our wheat. In the end all will be harvested but the weeds that are still within (and, trust me, there will still be weeds) will be burned. But they will be burned away by the fire of love, not the fire of damnation.

So, this parable is less a cautionary tale about how God will eternally damn those who have evil lurking within, as it is a parable of hope and joy. Anyone who is honest and who has ever been serious about trying to make themselves righteous and holy will admit that those pernicious weeds of resentment, anger, fear, judgement, territorialism and self-pity, to name only a few, take deep root and those roots are totally entangled with the roots of all that is good within us. When one weed seems eradicated, another one immediately pops up. In the end, when we come face to face with God, the weeds of our false selves will wither away in the fiery furnace of God's love.

And when that happens, it will be magnificent!
