

righteousness'. He didn't deem himself better than us; he didn't feel embarrassed to submit to a sacrament of cleansing that he didn't need. He wanted to be one with us in all ways, as God was calling him to do. That was the righteousness he was fulfilling: willingly submitting fully to God's plan and mission. Those of us who were baptized as infants couldn't make a conscious decision to submit fully to God's will, plan and mission for our lives but we have had a plethora of opportunities since to consciously submit ourselves to God. Every time we participate in a baptism, we are invited to renew our baptismal vows and we should be very aware of what we are doing and who we are consecrating ourselves to. It should also make us very aware that Jesus considers himself one of us. He never at any time acted as if he was better or deserved more than anyone else and he is very blessed when we treat each other the same way we treat him. "Whosoever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters, that you do to me."

It's easy to just rip off the replies to the baptismal vows without much thought but it actually could be a very enlightened time for us all. A whole church full of people are re-presenting their baptisms – making their baptisms present again. A whole church full! I think that if we all listened very carefully and openly at that time, we would hear something amazing. It would be the voice of God saying,

"These are my daughters and sons, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased!"

Ordinary Time begins again from Monday ...

What is Ordinary Time?

GREEN, the colour of Ordinary Time, tells us about its significance in the Church's life. It is the colour of growth and new life.

After the celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, Ordinary Time begins. Ordinary does not mean plain. The name comes from "ordinalis" meaning "showing order, denoting an order of succession"; the listing of ordinal, or sequential, numbers: to the order of the counted weeks, referring to the order of Sundays in the church year that do not fall into the major liturgical seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, or Easter.

In the Catholic church, the season of Ordinary Time consists of 33 or 34 weeks and is divided into two parts. The Roman Missal – Third Edition instructs that Ordinary Time "begins on the Monday following the Sunday after January 6 and continues until the beginning of Lent; it begins again on the Monday after Pentecost Sunday and ends on the Saturday before the First Sunday of Advent." Prior to the liturgical reforms of the Second Vatican Council, these periods on the calendar were referred to as "the season after Epiphany" and "the season after Pentecost." Although Ordinary Time takes place in two parts, it is still considered a single season.

Ordinary Time after the Baptism focuses on the early life and childhood of Christ, and then on His public ministry.

The second period of Ordinary Time is the longest liturgical season. Ordinary Time resumes after Pentecost and runs until the final Saturday before Advent. This period of Ordinary Time focuses on Christ's reign as King of kings, and on the age of the Church. This is the age we live in now; the time between the age of the Apostles and the age of Christ's second and final coming for which we are preparing. The final Sunday in Ordinary Time is the Feast of Christ the King.

The liturgical year is about growing in relationship with Jesus Christ. The richness of Ordinary Time is found in the opportunity to know Christ more intimately in the everyday realities of life. The gospel readings proclaimed on these Sundays reveal the teaching and healing and mission of Christ, allowing us to better understand God who became human. We learn that Christ is about humility rather than pride, vulnerability rather than power. We learn that Christ is about including the excluded, eating with social and religious outcasts, and dismantling structures of sin and injustice. We learn that Christ is about self-giving love that is only possible through authentic relationship. Ordinary Time is anything but monotonous. It is a time of conversion where we grow into who we are called to be by imitating the lived reality of Jesus.
