* Ascension of the Lord | 12 May 2024 *

I'm going to focus on Luke's account of the Ascension in the first reading. The first thing I want to point out is that the disciples asked Jesus, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" They still didn't get it. They were still hoping Jesus would lead Israel into political and religious freedom. No wonder Jesus had to visibly ascend and



disappear because as long as he was visibly present to them, they would continue to expect him to lead a huge Maccabean type rebellion and free Israel from Roman tyranny. He had to go in order to make space for his Holy Spirit to come and begin subtly infecting his followers and the world with a whole new way of gaining freedom. Today we would call that a querilla tactic!

To leave the life of the early church in the hands of these people who just couldn't grasp the basics of his message was also a sign of Christ's willingness to be vulnerable to our human weakness. But he left knowing that the Holy Spirit would come and that, in spite of the spiritual fragility of his followers, the Spirit would begin to spread like yeast in the church and in the world. We are still fragile followers. We still often don't get it. Just look at all the different Christian churches with differing dogmas in the world. Just look at our Catholic Church and all its disagreements and schisms over interpretations as to what is orthodox and what is not. If it was just up to human understanding and ability, our Church and every Christian church would be totally screwed.


But it's not up to us. Yes, Christ ascended in vulnerability, knowing we would continually get it wrong over and over, but he ascended in complete faith, knowing that his Holy Spirit would come and begin to leaven the whole loaf inexorably in spite of our continuing best efforts to thwart him.

Somehow, that's incredibly comforting!

OUR LADY OF FATIMA May 13

Between May 13 and October 13, 1917, three Portuguese children, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, and their cousin Lucia dos Santos, received apparitions of Our Lady at Cova da Iria near Fatima, a city 110 miles north of Lisbon. Mary asked the children to pray the rosary for world peace, for the end of World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia.

Mary gave the children three secrets. Following the deaths of Francisco and

Jacinta in 1919 and 1920 respectively, Lucia revealed the first secret in 1927. It concerned devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The second secret was a vision of hell. When Lucia grew up she became a Carmelite nun and died in 2005 at the age of 97.

Pope John Paul II directed the Holy See's Secretary of State to reveal the third secret in 2000; it spoke of a "bishop in white" who was shot by a group of soldiers who fired bullets and arrows into him. Many people linked this vision to the assassination attempt against Pope John Paul II in St. Peter's Square on May 13, 1981.

The feast of Our Lady of Fatima was approved by the local bishop in 1930; it was added to the Church's worldwide calendar in 2002.

ST. MATTHIAS May 14

The Acts of the Apostles (1:15-26) tells us that Matthias was chosen after the resurrection to replace Judas. Peter, quoting a psalm, told the 120 people gathered that they must choose a new apostle: someone who had been with



them from the time of the baptism of the Lord until the resurrection, someone who could join them in bearing witness to these events.

Two names were put forward and the assembly casts lots, the lot falling to Matthias. Nothing more is known of his life or apostolic work.

According to one tradition, Saint Matthias preached for a time in Jerusalem and eventually he was stoned and beheaded. He is often portrayed holding an axe, the instument of his death. Another tradition claims he preached the Gospel to the barbarians and cannibals in the interior of Ethiopia and was crucified.

Saint Matthias is the patron of carpenters, tailors, alcoholics, those with smallpox, and in prayers for perseverence and for hope.
