Happy Birthday, Fr. Jan! Saturday, 18 May 2024




Let's make a loaf of bread. To begin with you proof the yeast. You add a small amount of yeast to warm water and sugar and wait 10 minutes. By that time, you should see foamy bubbles and you will know the yeast is good and active and is ready to add to flour, water and salt. You mix it up and knead it until you have a firm but pliable dough and then...you wait. If you stand there and stare at the dough,

you won't see anything. But if you go away and come back in an hour or two, the dough will have risen beautifully. Then, shockingly, you beat down that dough and again let it rise again. The second rising gives the bread more elasticity (flexibility?), and makes it harder to deflate the dough.

In my head, when the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples at Pentecost, followed by a great bubbling up of miracles and spiritual activity, that was like the initial proofing of the yeast. It was easy to see the Spirit's action, be excited by it and have great anticipation of things to come. Yes, over the centuries there have been Spirit manifestations and miracles and pockets of excitement and anticipation but most of the time we are waiting and we can't see the yeast doing its inexorable job. It's easy to say nothing is happening. It's easy to assume the world is a lump of dough that's gone bad or that we have completely messed up our bread and the bread of the world.

But Pentecost was not just a single event that we commemorate once a year. The yeast of the Holy Spirit was given to the people of God to be the crucial ingredient that makes dough into wonderful bread and, get this, the yeast of the Spirit is still active and doing what it is meant to do! That dough can be punched down but all that does is make it more elastic and harder to deflate. Just because you can't witness the rising of the dough in the moment doesn't mean it's not happening.

The dough of the Spirit will rise no matter what!

## PENTECOST

The name comes from the Greek word 'pentekoste' which means fiftieth.



The holiday is celebrated on the seventh Sunday after Easter which is also fifty days after Easter, hence the name. Since its date depends on the date of Easter, Pentecost is a moveable feast, that is, the date is not fixed. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks. This important event in the Christian faith is described in the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 2:1–31), the fifth book of the New Testament of the Bible.

In Eastern Orthodox Christianity, Pentecost can refer to the entire fifty days of Easter through Pentecost. Pentecost is also called "White Sunday" or "Whitsunday." In the United Kingdom, traditionally, the next day, Whit Monday, was also a public holiday. In Germany, Pentecost is called "Pfingsten" and often coincides with the beginning of many outdoor and springtime activities. These include festivals and organized outdoor activities by youth organizations. The Monday after Pentecost is a legal holiday in many European nations.

#### BACK TO ORDINARY TIME After the Solemnity of Pentecost

Ordinary Time: Lasts 34 weeks covering twothirds of the Church's year of grace. This Season of Ordinary Time is observed as two periods of the year:

- Between the Seasons of Christmas and Easter: Ordinary Time begins right after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord in January.
- Between the Seasons of Easter and Christmas: Following the Solemnity of Pentecost (and sometimes called the "Sundays after Pentecost"), Ordinary Time resumes for some six months. ... leading us into the celebration of the Season of Advent once again.


