My dear brothers and sisters as your new pastor I am really happy to serve you. While I was preparing the homily


I am really happy to serve you. While I was preparing the homily for Thursday, the Gospel was of the beautiful prayer Jesus taught his disciples - the "Our Father". We are all children of this loving Father. Abba. As we call God our father, we are reminded that we

Father, Abba. As we call God our father, we are reminded that we are not alone. As children of God, we are all brothers and sisters. Our spiritual journey is not a solitary one; we walk and accompany each other.

As your pastor, I am blessed to be a part of this journey with you: to be on this beautiful spiritual voyage together. As a family, let us work for the Glory of God and for the spiritual nourishment of our parish. It is so beautiful that our parish is blessed to be home to different ethnic communities journeying together, with different languages, liturgies, and rites; adding more colour and happiness to our parish: Korean, Vietnamese, Polish, and the Syro-Malabar Malayali community from Kerala. This calls to mind a beautiful verse from Psalm 133:1:

"How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity." Let us work together and celebrate with our Lord.

In the bible, the sea represents chaos, disorder, the unknown and unpredictability. Jesus being sound asleep in a boat rocked by the storm is more than an incident story that shows Jesus's power to save and, especially, the disciples' general lack of faith. I think the disciples displayed a lot of faith by waking Jesus up and saying to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" If they had no faith in him, why would they wake

him up? Did they just want him to join in the general panic attack? They probably didn't know what he could do but he was their go to man.

This incident occurred earlier on in his ministry. The questions he put to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" seem unfair because his disciples were only beginning to be exposed to who he was. They asked, "Teacher, do you not care...?" To them he was still just an amazing, charismatic and intriguing teacher, which is why they were flabbergasted that even the wind and the sea obeyed him.

I think, quite possibly, what Jesus was saying to them was, "You don't need to be afraid. You have still not grasped who I really am." Of course, they hadn't and even with this added chunk of new information about the nature and power of this man they were following, they would continue to underestimate his power and his wisdom right up until Pentecost. They would continue to be small boats rocked by storms of chaos, disorder and the unknown – all things that Jesus is complete Lord of.

We are no different. Seas of chaos, disorder and the unknown really rock our boats. But we have enough faith to try to wake up the Lord by praying, "Lord, do you not care??" He absolutely does care and he absolutely is in control. What he asks of us is that we trust that he is awake, aware and in control. The storm gave the disciples an opportunity to add to their deposit of faith.

Our storms will do the same for us.



Nativity of St. John the Baptist

24 June 2024

Only three birthdays are celebrated on the Church's liturgical calendar, the Nativity of Our Lord (Dec. 25), the Nativity of His Mother (Sep. 8), and the Nativity of St. John the Baptist (June 24). St. John the Baptist was set apart from the



womb to prepare the way of the Lord and was a significant figure connected to the Incarnation and the Redemption. The Church honours him because of his role in preparing the way for Christ.

St. John the Baptist is one of the few saints who have two feast days. Each year the Church celebrates the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist on June 24, three months after the Annunciation on March 25th, since Elizabeth was already six months along when the angel appeared to Mary and Jesus was conceived (Luke 1:24-26), as well as the date of his martyrdom, on August 29. The exact date of St. John the Baptist's birth is not known.

St. John the Baptist is mostly known for being the cousin of Jesus and the principal figure who prepared the way for Christ before He began His public ministry. St. John's mother was St. Elizabeth, a relative of the Blessed Virgin Mary and wife of Zechariah, a member of the priestly class. Elizabeth was "barren" and both she and her husband were "of advanced age" when she conceived. She believed she would never have children when the Lord answered her prayers. St. Zechariah, his father, was a descendant of Aaron, and therefore a priest in the temple of Jerusalem. Once when he was serving in the temple, the angel Gabriel appeared to him and told him that his wife would bear a son and that he was to name him John. Because Zechariah doubted the words of the angel, he was made mute until the birth of John the Baptist. The full account of this encounter can be found in the Gospel of Luke 1:5-24.

In Matthew 11:10 Jesus said of John the Baptist.

"This is he of whom it is written, 'Behold, I send my messenger before thy face, who shall prepare thy way before thee.'

Truly, I say to you, among those born of women there has risen no one greater than John the Baptist; yet he who is least in the kingdom of heaven has suffered violence, and men of violence take it by force. For all the prophets and the law prophesied until John; and if you are willing to accept it, he is Elijah who is to come. He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

(Matthew 11:10-15)

Throughout the Old Testament, although taught and led by the prophets, people were unfaithful to God. God had sent prophets, just like he sent John the Baptist, to soften their hearts, call them to repentance, and truly prepare people for Christ's coming so they would be able to recognize Him and receive Him when they encountered Him. John was the last of these and the greatest.
